The British Isles is a group of islands in the northwest of Europe. Great Britain and Ireland are the most important islands. England, Scotland and Wales form Great Britain. The United Kingdom or UK is the political name for Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

The Union Jack is the name of the British flag. It is the symbol of the union of the countries of the UK.



The Republic of Ireland is an independent republic (Eire), with a different parliament.

## English in the world

Over 380 million people speak English as their first language. For about 470 million people in the world English is the second or official language. Many other countries learn English as a foreign language.




People in the USA speak English, but some words are different. For example, they say *vacation* instead of *holiday*.



People from Australia also speak English. They are called Aussies. Some words, like *boomerang* and *kangaroo*, come from the Aborigine culture.




People from New Zealand are called Kiwis. They speak English, too.



English is the second language in India and is very important in economic, industrial and political life.



In Canada and South Africa, English is the first language but people also speak other languages.



International organisations use English for communication.






