Coronal Polishing and Fluoride Application for the Expanded Functions Dental Assistant

Expanded Function Dental Assistants are now permitted to perform coronal polishing, administer fluoride treatments and take impressions for athletic appliances. There is currently proposed rulemaking before the Board of Dentistry that WOULD require a 3 hour course by the end of the 2013 renewal period.

Coronal Polishing will include instruction on types of stain, equipment options and polishing product recommendations as well as contraindications in relation to the medically compromised patient.

Fluoride application will provide a basic understanding of different types of fluoride and their recommendations for use as well as the appropriate application techniques. Both topics will be presented in lecture as well as clinical video demonstrations.
